



DESCRIPTION

This CME-accredited course offers a combination of didactic presentations and interactive small-group workshops designed to equip pediatricians, family physicians, and other child health clinicians with the latest evidence-based guidance for pediatric primary care. Participants will gain practical insights into a range of current and emerging topics, including the use of artificial intelligence in clinical practice, evaluation and management of neutropenia, newborn screening and genetic testing, firearm safety counseling, opioid use disorders, pharmacologic approaches to pediatric obesity, management of common sports injuries, recognition and treatment of cardiomyopathies, and more. This course provides an opportunity to enhance clinical decision-making, update knowledge of best practices, and improve patient care outcomes across diverse pediatric populations.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This activity is intended for pediatricians, family practitioners, nurse practitioners and physician assistants involved in providing primary care for infants, children and adolescents.

OBJECTIVES

After attending this activity, the learner will demonstrate the ability to:

- Apply the latest immunization recommendations from the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) to routine pediatric practice.
- Demonstrate effective communication strategies for addressing vaccine hesitancy among families.
- Identify best practices for diagnosing and managing eating disorders in children and adolescents, including early warning signs and referral criteria.
- Describe common barriers to managing pediatric hypertension and apply evidence-based strategies to overcome these challenges.
- Implement current guidelines for the evaluation and treatment of migraine headaches in children and teens, including pharmacologic and nonpharmacologic options.
