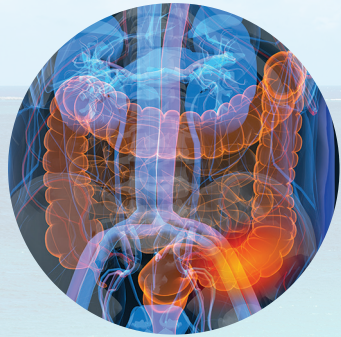

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Description

The 20th Annual Gastroenterology and Hepatology: Viva la Vida will provide, through formal lectures, question and answer sessions, and presentations of various gastrointestinal and liver disorders that will be of interest to practitioners in the field.
