### Description

Since our last conference, the diagnosis, treatment and overall care needs of breast cancer patients have become more complex. This is due to innovative improvements in therapies, better screening processes, and multidisciplinary care models developing across the U.S.. The indications for axillary node dissection continue to change. Immununotherapy with immune checkpoint blockade is achieving startling results in some patients. There are more options for molecular profiling of tumors, as well as more choices about systemic therapies and radiation therapy.
