DESCRIPTION

his one day course will address common pediatric musculoskeletal conditions and provide a forum to discuss office management, and referral criteria in order to enhance the care of pediatric patients locally. Small group educational sessions will be offered to address the educational need of the target audience.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This activity is intended for pediatricians, family practitioners, internists, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, physical therapists, orthopedic surgeons, fellows, and residents.

OBJECTIVES
