

Description

hanges in otolaryngology-head and neck surgery are occurring at a rapid pace including advances in transoral robotic surgery, endoscopic skull base surgery, diagnosis and treatment of patients with head and neck cancer, and the assessment and treatment of hearing loss. The goal of this course is to provide health care practitioners with a comprehensive update on current practices in all fields of otolaryngology-head and neck surgery.

Who Should Attend

- Use proper techniques for facial nerve monitoring during parotid surgery.
- Discuss the role of mastoid obliteration in the management of chronic otitis media.
- Use effective surgical principles in revision sinus surgery.
- Discuss new concepts in the management of tinnitus.
- Review surgical principles in endoscopic DCR.
- Utilize safe and effective techniques in pediatric tracheostomy.
- Discuss principles in the management of laryngeal trauma.
- Review the role of gastroesophageal reflux on laryngeal disorders.
- Outline surgical techniques for difficult thyroid surgery.
