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Description

Changes in otolaryngology-head and neck surgery are occurring at a rapid pace including advances in transoral robotic surgery, endoscopic skull base surgery, diagnosis and treatment of patients with head and neck cancer, and the assessment and treatment of hearing loss. The goal of this course is to provide health care practitioners with a comprehensive update on current practices in all fields of otolaryngology-head and neck surgery.

Who Should Attend

This course is designed for practicing otolaryngologists – head and neck surgeons, nurses, speech-language pathologists and audiologists. Some course lectures will also be intended for facial plastic surgeons, endocrine surgeons, neurosurgeons, and pediatricians.

Objectives

After attending this activity, the participant will demonstrate the ability to:

- List new concepts in the treatment of head and neck cancer.
- Discuss the use of balloon sinuplasty in the treatment of chronic rhinosinusitis.
- Outline surgical principles for the management of the difficult nasal septum.
- Utilize surgical techniques and practice management to incorporate endoscopic approaches to pituitary adenoma.
- Review the current diagnosis and management of allergic fungal sinusitis.
- Discuss current trends and research in the management of ankyloglossia.
- Recognize the proper evaluation of pediatric neck masses.
- Describe the workup and management of sudden hearing loss.
- Discuss the principles of laryngotracheal reconstruction.
- Utilize safe techniques for in-office injection laryngoplasty.
- Discuss the role of antibiotics in the treatment of chronic sinusitis.
- Use proper techniques for facial nerve monitoring during parotid surgery.
- Discuss the role of mastoid obliteration in the management of chronic otitis media.
- Use effective surgical principles in revision sinus surgery.
- Discuss new concepts in the management of tinnitus.
- Review surgical principles in endoscopic DCR.
- Utilize safe and effective techniques in pediatric tracheostomy.
- Discuss principles in the management of laryngeal trauma.
- Review the role of gastroesophageal reflux on laryngeal disorders.
- Outline surgical techniques for difficult thyroid surgery.
