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DESCRIPTION

Pathologists must confront ever changing classifications of neoplasms and newer treatments that are based on molecular mechanisms of diseases. Areas in which the field of medicine is changing revolve around lung tumors, soft tissue tumors, gastrointestinal stromal tumors, ovarian tumors, and pancreas neoplasms. Drawing on the expertise of past, present, and future Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP)/ American Registry of Pathology (ARP) fascicle authors in partnership with Johns Hopkins Pathology, topics of interest to general pathologists will be presented. Discussions will feature soft tissue tumors, gastrointestinal stromal tumors, ovarian, pancreatic, and lung tumors. Additionally, there will be a discussion of Barrett's esophagus and neoplasia incorporating 2016 guidelines from the American College of Gastroenterology, a discussion of stomach polyps, and a review of breast spindle cell lesions. This weekend update should be of interest to general surgical pathologists and pathology residents and fellows.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This activity is intended for pathologists and pathology residents.

OBJECTIVES

After attending this activity, the participant will demonstrate the ability to:

- Describe diagnostic clues for the most common soft tissue tumors.
- Recall the role of next generation sequencing in lung cancer.
- Discuss the explosion of new information concerning gastrointestinal stromal tumors.
- Analyze controversial topics in lung tumor pathology.
- Recognize breast mesenchymal lesions.
- Recall pitfalls in endometrial pathology.
- Apply increased diagnostic skills in gastroesophageal pathology.
- Classify solid tumors of the pancreas in a logical fashion.
