DESCRIPTION

Using a combination of didactic lectures and discussions, faculty members and invited speakers will present advances in diagnosis and treatment of cataract, glaucoma, refractive surgery (LASIK and PRK), and macular diseases, including new information on current trials and alternative concepts for dry, as well as wet, age-related macular degeneration. New vitreo-retinal surgical instrumentation and applications will be discussed. Presentations will be made on new imaging concepts, including optical coherence tomography systems.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This activity is intended for ophthalmologists, optometrists, and ophthalmic allied health professionals.

OBJECTIVES

- Integrate prescribed medical and surgical treatment options into everyday practice.

- Summarize the latest developments for the management of anterior segment problems.
- Assess the latest developments for the management of pediatric ophthalmology and strabismus conditions.
- Describe unique considerations for cataract surgery in patients with comorbid glaucoma.
