



DESCRIPTION

This one day activity will provide attendees an opportunity to review chronic pain issues, treatment methods and the consequences in active duty military and veterans. Leaders from Veterans Health Administration, Department of Defense and Johns Hopkins will provide lectures and discussions to improve the care of service members and veterans with chronic pain.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This activity is intended for psychiatrists, psychologists, primary care physicians, epidemiologists, nurse case managers, public health practitioners and researchers, advanced practice nurses, nurse researchers, policy makers, physician assistants, and physicians working in the Department of Defense and in the Veterans Health Administration.

· Recognize new ways to approach and engage patients in their treatment and instill hope in patients.

HOTEL AND TRAVEL INFORMATION

By Air: Baltimore is served by three major airports: Baltimore/Washington International Airport (BWI) in Maryland; Washington Dulles International Airport (IAD) and Ronald Reagan National Airport (DCA) in Northern Virginia.
