

DESCRIPTION

This one-day activity will provide an update on a wide range of topics of interest to the practicing gastroenterologist, surgeon, family physician and internist. Rapid advances are being made in the understanding of the pathophysiology, natural history and treatment of diseases of the digestive tract and liver. This course will offer practitioners a comprehensive overview of recent, cutting-edge advancements in gastroenterology and hepatology. A special emphasis will be on emerging therapies and concepts that will inform our practice in the future. Particular areas of focus will be advanced endoscopic techniques, Gl neoplasms, pancreatico-biliary pathology, liver diseases, hepatobiliary malignancies and liver transplantation.

Again, this year, we are happy to offer a simultaneous afternoon program for endoscopy nurses and technicians led by the therapeutic endoscopy staff at Sibley Memorial Hospital. This session will allow endoscopy nurses and technicians the opportunity for hands on exposure and practice on various accessories and devices used in therapeutic endoscopy including (and not limited to) clips, snares, FNA needles, biliary and pancreatic stents and luminal stents.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This activity is intended for gastroenterologists, general surgeons, family physicians, internists, endoscopy nurses, technicians and physicians interested in GI/Liver diseases.

OBJECTIVES

After attending this activity, the participant will demonstrate the ability to:

- Develop an evidence-based approach to the management of ampullary and duodenal polyps.
- Discriminate between Barrett's esophagus and eosinophilic esophagitis with particular emphasis on pathological findings.
- Enumerate the relative risks and benefits of endoscopic and bariatric approaches to the management of obesity.
- Summarize our current understanding of genomic-based approaches to cirrhosis and hepatocellular carcinoma, focusing on translational application of bench research to patient care.
- Discuss appropriate referral and evaluation criteria utilized in patients with advanced liver disease for liver transplantation and gain an understanding of the relative roles of deceased donor and live donor liver transplantation.
