DESCRIPTION

The mission of this annual conference pediatric critical care colloquium is to create a forum for ongoing discussion of the care of critically ill children, not only as it relates to pediatric critical care physicians, but to engage with other subspecialties that care for critically ill children. The theme of the 2018 colloquium is "At the Interface of Practice and Science", highlighting the new partnerships and advancements we are making in the pediatric critical care realm.
