DESCRIPTION

ue to rapid advances in technology, radiologists and radiologic technologists often require a comprehensive review of recent advances in computed body tomography. This activity will focus on multidetector/multislice CT and newer systems including dual-source CT scanners. The schedule offers a series of 40-minute lectures designed to concentrate on specific topics in-depth, including state-of-the-art technology and software. Participants will have the opportunity to expand their knowledge of the latest concepts and principles of helical CT, thoracic CT, cardiac CT and CTA, the uses of CT in the GI tract, the liver, spleen and kidneys, as well as pancreatic imaging and imaging the oncologic patient.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This activity is intended for radiologists and radiologic technologists.

OBJECTIVES

After attending this activity, the participant will demonstrate the ability to:

- Summarize the latest concepts in the chest and cardiac CT, including coronary artery imaging.
