DESCRIPTION

This two day conference will address both cutting edge and practical issues in surgical pathology in line with new volumes of the AFIP Fascicles that are appearing in 2019 and 2020. Key topics include salivary and sinonasal lesions, contemporary issues in breast needle biopsies, pathology of lung tumors in the modern era, gastrointestinal and liver pathology, and bore and soft tissue pathology with radiologic correlation. The conference will provide lecture and case-based formats, and questions and discussion will be encouraged.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This activity is intended for pathologists, nurses, NPs, PAs and pathology residents.

OBJECTIVES

After attending this activity, the participant will demonstrate the ability to:

- Describe key skeletal neoplasms.
- Address the most common issues in placental pathology.
- Explain placental lesions that require intervention.
- Address important lesions in hematopathology.
- Discuss esophageal injury that mimics gastroesophageal reflux disease.
- Explain the role of HPV in head and neck neoplasms.
- Recognize key nerve sheath tumors.
- Differentiate the most common myxoid soft tissue tumors.
