DESCRIPTION

Changes in otolaryngology-head and neck surgery are occurring at a rapid pace, including advances in transoral robotic surgery, endoscopic skull base surgery, diagnosis and treatment of patients with head and neck cancer, and the assessment and treatment of hearing loss. The goal of this course is to provide health care practitoners with a comprehensive update on current practices in all fields of otolaryngology-head and neck surgery.
