DESCRIPTION

Changes in otolaryngology—head and neck surgery are occurring at a rapid pace, including advances in transoral robotic surgery, endoscopic skull base surgery, diagnosis and treatment of patients with head and neck cancer, and the assessment and treatment of hearing loss. The goal of this course is to provide health care practitioners with a comprehensive update on current practices in all fields of otolaryngology—head and neck surgery.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This course is designed for practicing otolaryngologists—head and neck surgeons, nurses, speech-language pathologists and audiologists. Some course lectures will also be intended for facial plastic surgeons, endocrine surgeons, neurosurgeons, and pediatricians.

OBJECTIVES

After attending this activity, the learner will demonstrate the ability to:

- Recognize role of behavioral management for common laryngology complaints like globus pharyngeus, cough, and throat clearing.
- Explain recent advances in management of tinnitus and ear surgery.
- Describe the management of thyroid lesions through radiofrequency ablation.
